- 3) Pinckney Celebrates 175 years budget request –  
Motion by White to approve a budget not to exceed \$6000; Seconded by Stone.

4) Planning Commission Ordinance Revision  
Motion by Stone to defer to the State Act which indicates scheduling a minimum of 4 meetings a year; Seconded by MacDonald

5) Project Updates: Mill Street and Dexter-Pinckney Water Main  
Mill Street project changes will save the project about \$10K.  
We will be bumping out sidewalks and inserting pavers to go around light poles at S. Mill and Livingston Streets. Will take up approximately \$2K of above referenced savings.  
The bus drive is being removed at Village Education Center so sidewalk will run along road. This will provide two additional parking spaces on N. Mill.

Dexter-Pinckney Water Main is nearly complete. Waiting on arrival of hydrant and some testing will need to take place when that happens.

Well sight at Portage Dells. Sent apology letter to residents indicating that Village looked at it as a well project not a park project. Some good suggestions have come from the residents about the park. Foster will bring more details on this to future meetings.

6) Boy Scout Request –  
Withdrawn due to lack of insurance

7) DTE Tree Grant –  
If Foster is authorized to sign off on grant acceptance, Village will receive \$750 for trees to be planted on Mill Street (to replace trees that had to be removed) and at Portage Dells Loy Boyd park. Foster had indicated in grant application that she would purchase Autumn Blaze Maples, Crab Trees and Elm Trees. Estimating she will purchase at least 12 trees.  
Motion by MacDonald to give Foster approval to accept grant; Seconded by Lavey.

Motion carried in roll call vote.
